CHILDREN AND YOUTH FORMATION AND EDUCATION

Godly Play

Preschool (age 4) through 2nd grade children attend this program at 10:15 on Sundays (excluding holidays) from mid-September until the end of the school year. They meet on the 3rd floor and return to their parents during the Peace. Godly Play "helps children explore their faith through story, to gain religious language, and enhance their spiritual experience through wonder and play. Based on Montessori principles and developed using spiral curriculum, the Godly Play method serves children through childhood and beyond."

AND

Rotation Sunday School

3rd through 5th grade children attend the Rotation program from Sparkhouse at 10:15 on Sundays (excluding holidays) from mid-September until the end of the school year. They meet on the 3rd floor and return to their parents during the Peace. The Rotation program walks children through a journey of the Bible using several different mediums, including art, science, music, cooking, drama, and games. Each story is told for three weeks using a different medium, giving children the opportunity to learn and experience them in hands-on ways. This isn't your mama's Sunday School class!
