Advent

Advent (from the Latin word *adventus,* meaning "coming") is considered to be the beginning of the Church Year, the Christian New Year. We will count these four Sundays before Christmas Eve, and wait, watch, and hope for the "coming" of Christ.

The Seasonal Color of Advent - Blue


The vestments and adornments of the sanctuary, including the candles for the Advent Wreath, at St. John's are blue in the tradition of the Sarum rite (i.e., the traditions associated with Salisbury Cathedral, England) – practiced in Great Britain from the 11th century through the Protestant Reformation. The vibrant colors symbolize the jubilant cry, "Rejoice in Expectation!" and also represent the darkened sphere of earth, our living in darkness, awaiting Christ.

The Lessons – Notes on the Lectionary beginning in the Season of Advent The Readings in the Episcopal Church (and in most liturgical Christian Churches around the world) are taken from a three-year cycle of scriptural passages known as the Revised Common Lectionary. This Advent season (which marks the beginning of the liturgical year), we begin year B and as such the majority of our Gospel readings are taken from the Gospel of Mark. In year C the readings come from Luke's Gospel and in Year A they come from Matthew's Gospel. Readings from the Gospel of John are inserted periodically in all years.



ADVENT WREATH

The first and second candle of the Advent Wreath are lighted

Lighting the Third Candle of the Advent Wreath: This custom of candle lighting was derived from the Jewish Sabbath practice and was a regular occurrence in the early Christian house churches. As time went on, the practice was carried over to the larger assemblies outside of homes. The candles are a way of counting down the Sundays that lead to the birth of Jesus. Today, we light the first, second, and third candles (blue and pink) and say a prayer expressing our longing for the world.

Lector A reading from Zephaniah

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: * as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.


THE SECOND LESSON

THE HOLY GOSPEL

Clergy **†**The Holy Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Luke.*People* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.


Oblation bearers bring forward the gifts of bread and wine on behalf of the congregation.



Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. *AMEN*.


THE LORD'S PRAYER




