

Words About Today's Worship Service – All Saints' Day/All Souls' Day and Baptism

On All Saints' Day/All Souls' Day we remember all the saints and our loved ones that have gone before us. We recall the "Body of Christ" that is made up of all people everywhere, people who are living, and people who have already died. In a tradition at St. John's, we build a shrine commemorating those who have died. Pictures, candles, and other mementos of those we love help us remember that, though dead, they are very present to us because they live forever in the heart of God. Please visit the shrine after communion today. We invite you to light a candle at the intercessory to remember someone that you love who has died. You may also say their names silently or aloud at the appointed time during the Eucharistic Prayer.

Today is also a day to remember that we are children of God, a sibling of Jesus Christ! But we forget this, so the church gives us a way to remember. It is called baptism. Some of us are lucky enough to remember our own baptisms, but most of us cannot. After we baptize the candidates and renew our Baptismal vows, the clergy will walk down the aisle with the water from the baptismal font and *asperge* you, which means 'to wash' and 'to awaken.' As you are 'asperged,' the clergy will say the words "Remember your baptism." At the ringing of a bell, the people stand



THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Keeping a tradition at St. John's, members are invited to bring water from places around the world which hold significant meaning to us. We mingle these waters for use at baptisms as a sign of our diversity and unity. Today's waters come from: the Jordan River in the Holy Land; all five of the Great Lakes; and the Pacific Ocean. The Presider blesses the water, first saying

Presider	God be with you.
People	And also with you.
Presider	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People	It is right to give God thanks and praise.

The Presider continues

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, O God, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water

†Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. *Amen.*

THE BAPTISM

The candidate is presented by name to the Presider, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate saying

Presider N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

Then the Presider places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross using Chrism oil and saying to each one

Presider N., † you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

The Clergy presents the candidate with a candle lit from the Paschal candle.

Clergy Receive the Light of Christ. Amen. Let us pray.


The Priest, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them saying







We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."



The people are invited to gather at the at the Shrine of Remembrance in the West Transept and light a candle or write the names of their loved ones to honor and remember those who have died.


